Re: FOIA Pre-Authorization Request – 2011 PAC 14468

Dear Officer Kelly:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Chicago Police Department (CPD) of its intention to deny certain photographs as exempt from disclosure under section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c) (West 2010)). CPD is seeking to withhold photographs which depict the body of a deceased victim.

On April 8, 2011, [REDACTED] submitted a FOIA request to CPD seeking a copy of the homicide file and photos related to [REDACTED], who was found murdered on October 6, 1976, in Chicago. In its written notice, CPD seeks our office's approval to withhold five of the fifteen photographs responsive to [REDACTED] request. CPD asserts that three photographs are of a sensitive nature and display the body of the victim.

DETERMINATION

Section 7(1)(c) exempts from inspection and copying "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy." The exemption defines "unwarranted invasion of personal privacy" as "the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information." 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c) (West 2010).

CPD's assertion of the section 7(1)(c) exemption with regard to the photographs is **approved**. The photographs in question are of a decedent's body. After reviewing the photos in

question, this office has determined that the highly personal nature of these photographs outweighs any legitimate public interest in the disclosure of this information. Therefore, CPD has met its initial burden and may withhold the photographs under section 7(1)(c). CPD should issue a partial denial letter directly to [REDACTED] in accordance with this letter, if it has not already done so.
