RE: FOIA Pre-Authorization Request - 2011 PAC 15774

Dear Trooper Sutton:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Illinois State Police (ISP) of its intention to deny certain information as exempt from disclosure under section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) (5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c) (West 2010). Specifically, [REDACTED] submitted a FOIA request to the ISP for laboratory report No.C11-014966. ISP is seeking to redact from the requested documents the names of possible suspects who were not arrested or charged in connection with the incident.

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless the disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information." The exemption defines "unwarranted invasion of personal privacy" as "the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information." 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c) (West 2009 Supp.), as amended by Public Act 96-1378, effective July 29, 2010.

DETERMINATION

The ISP's use of the exemption in section 7(1)(c) to redact suspects' names is **approved**. We have concluded that the ISP has met its initial burden to demonstrate that the disclosure of the names of people suspected of crimes for which they were never arrested or charged would be highly objectionable to a reasonable person. Under these circumstances, the

suspects' right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in the information that [insert name of public body] intends to redact from the report.
