Dear Trooper Sutton:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Illinois State Police (ISP) of its intention to deny certain information as exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*, as amended. ISP is seeking to redact dates of birth from the requested document.

██████████ submitted a FOIA request on April 12, 2010 for Field Report #12-10-125. In its written notice, ISP asserted that the date of birth is exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA.

Determinations with respect to 7(1)(c)

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying “[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information.” 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). The exemption defines “[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy” as “the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.” *Id.*

ISP’s use of the Section 7(1)(c) exemption with regard to the date of birth is approved. We have determined that the disclosure of dates of birth would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information.

As such, ISP may issue a partial denial letter and release of the records with the appropriate information redacted. Please note, we express no opinion on whether ISP’s use of the Section 7(1)(b) exemption was proper with regard to the above-referenced FOIA request.
