RE: Pre-Authorization Request - 2010 PAC 6835

Dear Ms. Briggs:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Town of Normal (Town) of its intention to deny certain information as exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*, as amended (FOIA). The Town in seeking to redact dates of birth and information related to injury and medical care from the requested document.

██████████ submitted a FOIA request on April 8, 2010 for Accident Report #A10-367. In its written notice, the Town asserted that the dates of birth and information related to injury and medical care are exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA.

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information." 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). The exemption defines "[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy" as "the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information." *Id.*

**Determinations**

The Town's use of the Section 7(1)(c) exemption with regard to the date of birth is approved. We have determined that the disclosure of dates of birth would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information.

In addition, the Town's use of the exemption in 7(1)(c) with regard to injury and medical care is approved. This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and a person's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information.


Accordingly, if it has not already done so, the Town may issue a partial denial letter directly [REDACTED] and release the records to her with the dates of birth and information related to injury and medical care redacted.
