RE: Pre-Authorization Request – 2010 PAC 6899

Dear Ms. Briggs:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Town of Normal (Town) of its intention to deny certain information as exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*, as amended. The Town is seeking to redact information regarding the health of individual(s) in a police report.

██████████ submitted a FOIA request seeking incident report regarding an incident on April 2, 2010. In its written notice, the Town asserted that health, including mental health, information, is exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA.

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying “[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information.” 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). The exemption defines “[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy” as “the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.” *Id.*

Determinations

The Town’s use of the exemption in Section 7(1)(c) with regard to health information is approved. We have determined that the disclosure of health information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy under Section 7(1)(c). 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information.


Accordingly, if the Town has not already done so, it may issue a partial denial letter directly the requester and release the record to him with the appropriate information redacted.
