RE: FOIA Pre-approval Request – 2010 PAC 6960

Dear Ms. Briggs:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Town of Normal of its intent to deny access to and redact from police reports requested by [REDACTED] dates of birth, insurance policy numbers and information about medical conditions and treatment as exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act, 5 ILCS 140/9.5(b).

Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act permits a public body to withhold “[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.” That provision further defines an “unwarranted invasion of personal privacy” as “the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.”

As a result of our review, we have determined that it is **appropriate** to withhold dates of birth, insurance policy numbers, and information regarding individuals’ medical conditions and treatment in the reports under **Section 7(1)(c)**. Such information is highly personal in nature and its release would likely be viewed as objectionable to a reasonable person. Additionally, an individual’s interest in maintaining the privacy of that information outweighs any public interest in its disclosure. Thus, the request to assert the exemption under **Section 7(1)(c)** is hereby approved and further inquiry into this matter is not warranted.


Please note that this determination is **only** intended to address the applicability of the **Section 7(1)(c)** exemption to the specific information identified and does not address the applicability of other exemptions to the information or records in question.
