RE: FOIA Pre-approval Request– 2010 PAC 10332

Dear Ms. Banister:

We have received from the University of Illinois a written notice of its intention to assert the Section 7(1)(c) exemption (5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c)) in response to a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request submitted by [REDACTED] request sought records pertaining to a police report concerning the death of [REDACTED]. The University has indicated that it intends to withhold post-mortem photographs responsive to this request, pursuant to Section 7(1)(c).

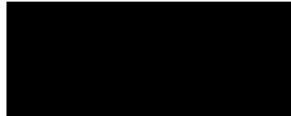
Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act permits a public body to withhold “[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.” That provision further defines an “unwarranted invasion of personal privacy” as “the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.” It also provides that “[t]he disclosure of information that bears on the public duties of public employees and officials shall not be considered an invasion of personal privacy.”

**Determination**

The University seeks to withhold certain post-mortem photographs of the deceased. We have previously determined that graphic photographs of a decedent are properly subject to withholding under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA. *See* Public Access Opinion 10-003, issued October

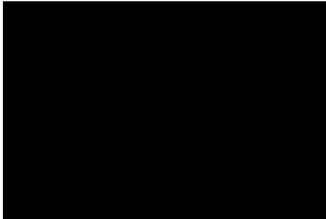
22, 2010.<sup>1</sup> Likewise, in this case, we have determined that the University has met its initial burden of demonstrating that these photographs are exempt under Section 7(1)(c).
