

The undersigned is a FOIA Officer for the City of Park Ridge. The City intends to deny your request in part for the following reasons:

Dates of birth of persons who filed a complaint with or provided information to a law enforcement agency have been redacted pursuant to Section 7(1)(c) because disclosure of that information would likely be highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and the subject's right to privacy outweighs any public interest in releasing it.

Home addresses, phone numbers, license numbers and other private information have been redacted pursuant to Section 7(1)(b) as disclosure of private information is exempt.

The name of the individual who filed a complaint with or provided information to a law enforcement agency has been redacted pursuant to Section 7(1)(d)(iv).

Portions of the narrative of this request have been denied pursuant to Section 7(1)(d)(i) because release of such record(s) would interfere with law enforcement proceedings pending in the Circuit Court of Cook County

That information will not be made available for inspection and/or copying.

You also have the right to judicial review pursuant to Section 11 of the Freedom of Information Act.
