RE: FOIA Pre-Authorization Request – 2010 PAC 9111

Dear Mr. Reuter:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) of its intention to withhold certain information as exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(f) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). 5 ILCS 140/1 *et. seq.*, as amended.

Specifically, on July 13, 2010, [REDACTED] submitted a FOIA request to the IEPA seeking copies of records relating to the Phibro-Tech Inc. facility in Joliet, Illinois.

On August 13, 2010, the IEPA sent a denial letter to [REDACTED] explaining that a 1990 scoring sheet and a 1996 internal memorandum are exempt from disclosure pursuant to Section 7(1)(f), which exempts from inspection and copying "preliminary drafts, notes, recommendations, memoranda and other records in which opinions are expressed, or policies are formulated, except that a specific record or relevant portion of a record shall not be exempt when the record is publicly cited and identified by the head of the public body." 5 ILCS 140 7(1)(f).

Determinations

The IEPA's request for approval of its decision to withhold information pursuant to Section 7(1)(f) is approved. This Office has reviewed the memorandum and scoring sheet supplied to us by the IEPA relating to the Phibro-Tech Inc. facility and we have determined that that the documents are preliminary in nature and fall within the scope of Section 7(1)(f).

Additionally, there is no evidence that this information has been publicly cited and identified by the head of the public body. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(f).


Based on this analysis, the IEPA has met its burden under Section 7(1)(f) and may withhold the documents in question.
