RE: Pre-Authorization Request — 2010 PAC 9285

Dear Mr. Recupito:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Round Lake Police Department (Department) of its intention to deny disclosure of certain information as exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*, as amended.

██████████ submitted a FOIA request dated August 19, 2010, seeking a police report regarding a particular individual who was arrested. In its written notice, the Department asserted that dates of birth and photocopies of the individual's driver's license and military identification card are exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA.

Determination

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information." 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). The exemption defines "[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy" as "the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information." *Id.*

The Department's use of the exemption in Section 7(1)(c) with regard to dates of birth is approved. We have determined that the disclosure of dates of birth would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy under Section 7(1)(c). 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information.

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However, the Department's use of the exemption in Section 7(1)(c) with regard to photocopies of the arrestee's military identification card and driver's license is denied. In light of the fact that the individual was charged and arrested for a crime, we have determined that the disclosure of this information would not constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy under Section 7(1)(c). 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c).

The Department may wish to withhold "private information" contained on these photocopies that may be exempt under Section 7(1)(b). "Private information" means unique identifiers, including a person's social security number, driver's license number, employee identification number, biometric identifiers, personal financial information, passwords or other access codes, medical records, home or personal telephone numbers, and personal email addresses. Private information also includes home address and personal license plates, except as otherwise provided by law or when compiled without possibility of attribution to any person." 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(b). Use of this exemption to partially deny disclosure of public records does not require preapproval from our Office.

As such, the Department may issue a partial denial letter directly to [REDACTED] and release the records to him with the appropriate information redacted.
