RE: Pre-Authorization Request – 2010 PAC 7855

Dear Ms. Nistler:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the City of Park Ridge Police Department (Department) of its intent to deny disclosure of dates of birth as exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c).

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying “[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information.” 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). The exemption defines “[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy” as “the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject’s right of privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.” *Id.*

**Determination**

The Department’s use of the exemption in Section 7(1)(c) with regard to dates of birth is **approved**. A date of birth is highly personal information, and the subjects’ right to privacy with respect to this information outweighs any legitimate public interest in its disclosure. As such, disclosure of the dates of birth would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA.
