RE: Pre-Authorization Request — 2010 PAC 8305

Dear Ms. Nistler:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Park Ridge Police Department (Department) of its intent to deny disclosure of certain information as exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*, as amended.

LexisNexis submitted a FOIA request dated June 22, 2010, seeking police report 1011797. In its written notice, the Department asserted that dates of birth and a narrative excerpt are exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA.

Determination

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information." 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). The exemption defines "[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy" as "the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information." *Id.*

The Department's use of the exemption in Section 7(1)(c) with regard to dates of birth is approved. We have determined that the disclosure of dates of birth would constitute a clearly unwarranted

invasion of personal privacy under Section 7(1)(c). 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information.

The Department's use of the exemption in Section 7(1)(c) with regard to the proposed redaction from the narrative of the report is also approved. The sentence which the Department proposes to redact does not relate directly to the offense alleged. In this case, the Department has met its burden of demonstrating that the information contained in the excerpt may be withheld pursuant to Section 7(1)(c).

As such, the Department may issue a partial denial letter directly to LexisNexis and release the records with the appropriate information redacted.
