Dear Ms. Kavanaugh:

We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Schaumburg Police Department (Department) of its intention to deny disclosure of certain information pursuant to Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*, as amended.

██████████ submitted a FOIA request dated September 15, 2010, seeking a copy of Report #10-22433. In its written notice, the Department asserted that dates of birth and third party names are exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA.

Determination

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying “[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information.” The exemption defines “[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy” as “the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.” *Id.*

The Department’s use of the exemption in Section 7(1)(c) with regard to dates of birth is approved.

We have determined that the disclosure of dates of birth would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy under Section 7(1)(c). 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information.

The Department's use of the exemption in Section 7(1)(c) with regard to third party names of individuals who were never arrested or charged is also approved. We have determined that the disclosure of this information would be highly objectionable to a reasonable person. The subjects' right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining this information. Therefore, the disclosure of this information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c).

As such, the Department may issue a partial denial letter directly to [REDACTED] and release the record to her with the appropriate information redacted.
