
We have received and reviewed the written notice from the Park Ridge Police Department (Department) of its intention to deny disclosure of certain information pursuant to Section 7(1)(c) of the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA). 5 ILCS 140/1 et seq., as amended.

submitted a FOIA request dated October 25, 2010, seeking copies of all Police Reports concerning two individuals named in the request, for the year 2010. In its written notice, the Department asserts that certain narrative information and dates of birth are exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA.

Determinations

Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA exempts from inspection and copying "[p]ersonal information contained within public records, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information." The exemption defines "[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy" as "the disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information." *Id*.

The Department's use of the Section 7(1)(c) exemption with regard to dates of birth is <u>approved</u>. We have determined that the disclosure of dates of birth would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information.

The Department's use of the Section 7(1)(c) exemption with regard to the narrative portions of certain reports is also approved. We have determined that disclosure of this information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of privacy because it pertains to a sensitive matter pertaining to a domestic relationship. This type of information is highly personal by its very nature and the subject's right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in disclosing this information. Accordingly, the Department has met its burden of demonstrating that this information is exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) of FOIA. As such, the Department may issue a partial denial letter directly to the requester and release the records in accordance with this letter.
