Dear Deputy Chief Nearing:

We have received and reviewed a notice of intention to deny issued by the Champaign Police Department (Department) in response to [REDACTED] request for records under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*, as amended. [REDACTED] requested records regarding an incident pertaining to his adult daughter, [REDACTED]. The Department requested pre-approval to withhold the records pursuant to Section 7(1)(c) (5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c)).

Information in public records is exempt personal information if disclosure would “constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless the disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information.” 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). An “[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy” is the “disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.” *Id.*

The Department’s request to withhold the records pursuant to Section 7(1)(c) is **approved**. We have reviewed copies of the records, which contain information that is highly personal by its very nature. A subject’s right to privacy right outweighs any legitimate public interest in the disclosure of this type of information.
