Re: Pre-authorization request – 2010 PAC 11073

Dear Ms. Godette:

We have received from the Village of Tinley Park (Village) a notice of intention to deny disclosure of certain information requested under the Freedom of Information Act. 5 ILCS 140/1 *et seq.*, as amended. [REDACTED] requested a copy of police report No. 10-27717. The Village asserted that birth dates of individuals listed in the report are exempt from disclosure under Section 7(1)(c) (5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c)).

Information in public records is exempt if disclosure would “constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, unless the disclosure is consented to in writing by the individual subjects of the information.” 5 ILCS 140/7(1)(c). An “[u]nwarranted invasion of personal privacy” is the “disclosure of information that is highly personal or objectionable to a reasonable person and in which the subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in obtaining the information.” *Id.*


Determination

The Department’s request for pre-approval to redact birth dates pursuant to Section 7(1)(c) is **approved**. Birth dates are a highly personal form of information, the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. A subject’s right to privacy outweighs any legitimate public interest in the disclosure of his or her date of birth.
